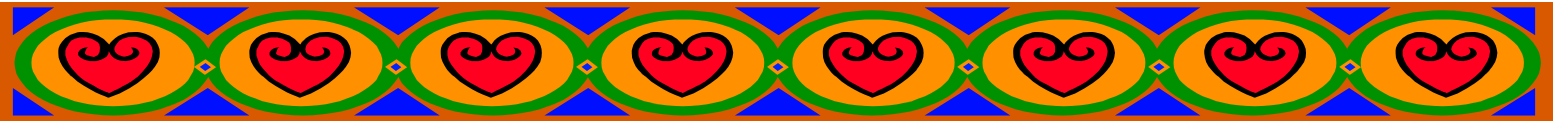
## Saying Grace at Thanksgiving

## WAY Cool Sunday School November Schedule

The name of our Children's Religious Education program (CRE) is **WAY Cool Sunday School**. Now is the time for families to register their children in the program. We need parents and other adults to be involved in this cooperative program, so please sign up for a volunteer opportunity. The children's **classes** take place two or three times a month. On the other Sundays, the children participate either in a **Children's Chapel** or a **multigenerational Sunday service**, which includes their participation in songs, stories, readings and skits.

The **WAY** acronym stands for the names of the three Classes with the following age groups:

**"Wanderers"** - Pre-kindergarten through second-graders meet in the Beach room. This year the Wanderers will be experiencing the stories of **Dr. Seuss** and how they teach UU ideas and values.

**"Adventurers"** - Third through sixth-graders meet in the Rain Forest room. This year the Adventurers will be using a curriculum called **"Keepers of the Earth,"** which shows how UU ideas and values can be learned within the context of Native American traditions.

**"Youth Pathfinders"** - Seventh through twelfth-graders meet in the Teen Room. Youth Pathfinders will follow a chalice circle format while using the curriculum called **"Sharing the Journey."** The youth will select some of their own **social justice projects**. They will offer their leadership for engaging other ages from throughout the congregation in the projects.

The **goals** of the CRE program are:

- multigenerational community building
- strengthening UU identity
- combining fun with learning
- visible participation of young people in our Sunday services

#### **Chalice Circle** with Rev. Julie

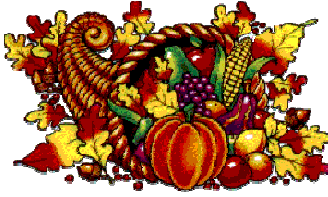
A sharing group based on a monthly topic and life reflection questions. Newcomers and parents are especially welcomed to sample this ongoing monthly program, available in several times and locations.

During the past nine months a Task Force was created to address some renovation and creative ideas about updating and enhancing the Sanctuary. The group has now been unofficially referred to as the “FIG” or Facility Improvement Group, however, officially it started as UU Facilities Improvement Team. Several members have attended gatherings offered in the evening, on Sunday after church and with the Finance Committee meetings. This fall the resurgence of the group has begun to focus on how to creatively fund this project and plan for renovation to address the sound, lighting, painting, carpeting and overall beautification to reflect the warm atmosphere our congregation willingly gives on a daily basis.

To date, we have donations contributed to the “Renovation Fund” and anticipate the funding will be separate from our yearly pledge drive. Everyone will be encouraged and included with support of the project through thoughts, prayers, patience and encouragement. All renovations take time and “messiness” with glitches along the way...but we have pulled together on many occasions and always come out with the focus on healthy relationships and interactions in our congregation. The heart of our community repeatedly shines through our faces as we rise to new and different challenges.

Tip McAlpin, of McAlpin Interiors, has agreed to create a “board” for the congregation to look at, which will include suggestions and swatches of color and design for the Sanctuary. There will also be prices included so the Congregation and Board can make intelligent decisions about how to proceed with the confidence that our efforts and work will be productive.

Hopefully, we will have something to look at in November at our Thanksgiving Feast on Sunday, November 20, 2011. It will be displayed before if available.

# UUCP SOCIAL JUSTICE NEWS

## UUA President Rev. Peter Morales's statement regarding the Occupy Wall Street movement



"The Occupy Wall Street movement that has now spread to other cities across the country is a public outcry of frustration and anger. The protestors have taken to the streets to draw attention to the fact that our economic system has not only failed to protect the most vulnerable among us, it has preyed on the majority for the benefit of very few. The Occupy protests are a wake-up call that the American people are in great peril, and we have been for some time.

"It is not surprising that Americans have had to take to the streets to get the attention of our leaders. For too long, we have seen attention paid to banks that are 'too big to fail' while the plight of the poor and the working class goes unaddressed. For too long, we have been pitted against each other by those in power, by a corrupt economic system that pushed us to consume more and to 'get ours' at any cost. Now we know: The cost is too great, and is ultimately without satisfaction.

"Last Sunday, I had the opportunity to join the Occupy Boston protesters in this city's financial district. Unitarian Universalist ministers from several of our Massachusetts congregations came together to organize an evening vespers service at the Occupy Boston encampment, offering spiritual support and encouragement to the hundreds of souls gathered there.

"I was honored to bear witness to this historic event, and grateful for the chance to stand side by side with Unitarian Universalist ministers showing such passionate devotion to our Fourth Principle: The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large. And I know that our ministers and congregants have played similar roles at the other Occupy events across the country.

"Unitarian Universalism embodies a long tradition of working for economic justice and workers' rights. Today is another opportunity for us to live our faith, and the Occupy protests are a first step on the road to repairing our country.

"I reach out to Unitarian Universalists everywhere to consider how you might be of service to any among us who are struggling to provide for their families, those who have been cheated and abused by financial institutions, and all those whose backs ache under a burden of debt, unemployment, and fading hope. Let the world see the power of our faith in action.

"And if these protests are truly planting the seeds of a reformation – even a revolution – may those seeds be nurtured by love. May the change come from a place of compassion and good will. And may all those involved know this: **We are with you.**"

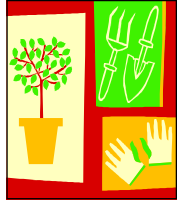
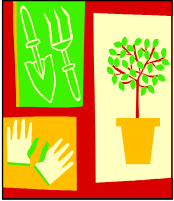


### Books for Prisoners



Directed by Neil Cobb, the two performers include a veteran of UU Productions, Don Parker, and a newcomer to our stage, Sharon Windt. They promise to cause much laughter as well as great trepidation!!

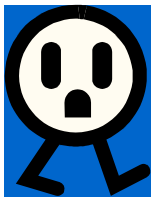

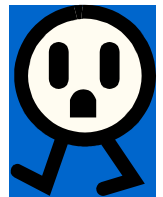

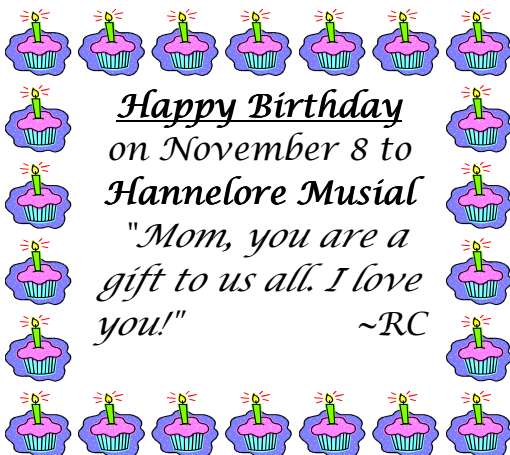
